Anna Mae LeDuc, 95, of Plymouth, Michigan went home to the Lord on Saturday, August 26, 2023, after a brief illness.

Anna Mae was born on October 2, 1927, in Escanaba, Michigan, daughter of Rudolph Johnson and Mary Johnson - Kehoe. She graduated from Escanaba High School in 1945 and worked for over 35 years as a telephone operator for Michigan Bell Telephone Company.
